Subject: Open letter regarding United States UN policy

Madam Secretary,

Thank you for clarifying America's counter terrorism policy with Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon and others on September 27 2010.

I am concerned about America's future security and the welfare of all nations striving for improved welfare and human rights in our world. Please clarify for myself and others, the United State's policies regarding this.

Does the United States support United Nations goals of global welfare and lawful process? Are the globalisation of *lawful process*, the *International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights*, and the *International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights* beneficial to US foreign policies? Were UN General Assembly resolution 1752 (XVII) and our vote in accord with previous Assembly resolutions *1514* and *1541 (XV)*, the *United Nations charter* and the *Universal Declaration of Human Rights*? And does the United States object to the International Court of Justice being allowed to provide advisory opinion on the legality of international agreements and the sovereignty of the people who were the subject of General Assembly resolution 1752 (XVII)?
