
Security Treaty – for whose benefit?

If Australians don't speak up who will?


The deceptions do not matter - West Papua is a colony.

1935 Standard Oil sponsored a 60% share of the Netherlands New Guinea Petroleum Company (NNPM)

1936 NNPM discovers Ertsberg ("Ore Mountain") 1959 Dutch begin search for source of alluvial gold 1959 Rockefeller's Freeport Sulphur seeks alliance with Dutch East Borneo Company to lodge request to explore Ertsberg area

1962 McGeorge Bundy (Skull & Bones member) & Robert Komer convince Kennedy West Papua must be sacrificed to save our world from communism. 1967 Freeport gets first 30 year license to mine West Papua

In January 2006, 43 West Papuan asylum seekers set off on an historic journey by dug-out canoe from their beloved homeland, fleeing persecution at the hands of the Indonesian Military (TNI).





Although denied public schooling or access to English, they had prepared a banner to ensure their message was heard.

Our government responded by flying them to Christmas Island.

George Bush and John Howard support the Indonesian military (TNI) who repress freedom of speech and are business associates of U.S. companies like Exxon, Freeport McMoRan, and Bechtel. We ask Australians to support the people of the Provinces, like West Papua, instead of the military.
