

Indonesia Demands Manila Oust Rebel From West Irian

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MANILA, Sept. 3—Indonesia protested today the presence in this country of a so-called Papuan freedom fighter, Niclass Jouwe of West Irian, the former Netherlands New Guinea. Jakarta asked the Philippines Government to deport him. The Indonesian Ambassador, Abdul Karim Rasjid, filed the protest with Under Secretary Librado Cayce of the Foreign Ministry.

Mr. Jouwe, chairman of a group calling itself the Freedom Committee of West Papua (West Irian) met newsmen Monday and denounced President Sukarno of Indonesia as having suppressed Papuans "who do not wish to live under the neocolonialism imposed on them by the dictator, Sukarno."

Mr. Jouwe said Papuans in West Irian had revolted. He said the Indonesians then started a systematic suppression by "killing Papuan intellectuals, forcing able-bodied Papuans into the army to fight in Malaysian Borneo and sending Javanese farmers, now about 10,000, who have taken Papuans." He appealed to Filipinos to help the Papuans in the struggle for independence.

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
