

Rebel 'President' Reported

JAKARTA, May 10 (Reuters) —Rebels in West Irian have named a president to head a state called Papua separated from Indonesia, it was announced here today.

An Indonesian Army spokesman said that documents seized from the rebels showed that they had named as president Marcus Kassiempo, a leader of the banned Free Papua Movement who lives in the Netherlands.

Government officials just returned from Biak Island said today that the situation there was tense, with troops patrolling the streets and a curfew in force at night.
